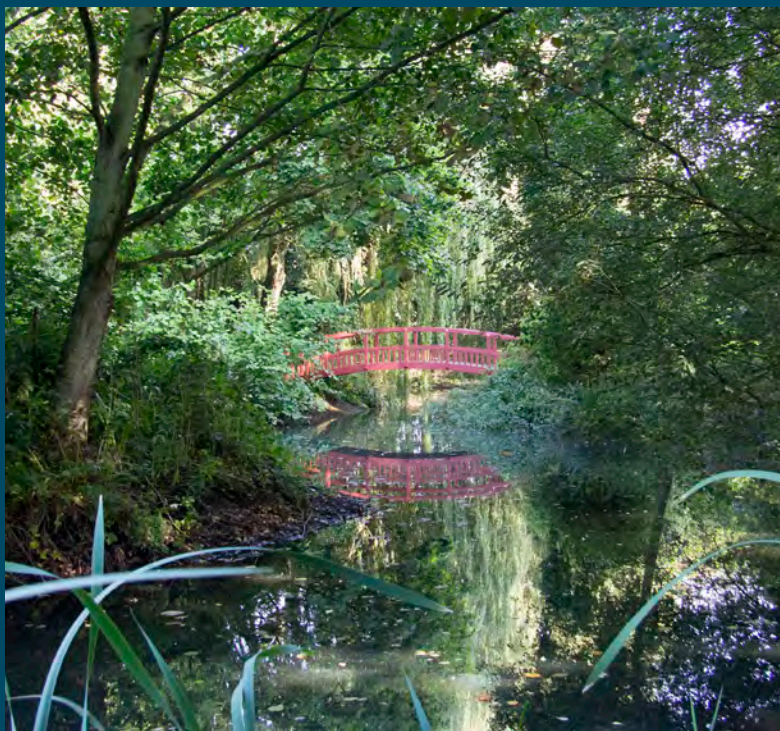

EVERINGHAM

ELLERKER HOUSE



Ellerker House was once the office belonging to Everingham Estate, owned by the Duke of Norfolk. Roz Los' garden is 5 acres and comprises parkland, home to many mature trees including Corsican pines, beech and many oaks, and a formal lawn surrounded by colour-themed herbaceous borders planted for texture and colour throughout the year. A rose archway planted with old English roses leads towards the lake which is surrounded by a woodland pathway made from tree roots and stumps and planted with many spring bulbs, hellebores and anemones to give a mass of colour, and extensive woodland to walk in.

OPEN: Sunday 25 Sept, 12 - 4pm

LOCATION: Everingham. 5½m from Pocklington. Just out of the village heading towards Harswell

PARKING: drive through the main gates and park along the drive



LASTINGHAM

LITTLEGARTH



Rob Laycock and Patsie Harper's one acre garden at Littlegarth on the edge of Lastingham has areas containing old and new herbaceous borders, lawns and vegetables, a pond and greenhouse. We have introduced ornamental grasses into the garden and currently we have two beehives and three pet Silkies running free. The garden is dominated by a 33 metre high Corsican pine. PARKING: Parking is available in the village requiring only a short walk to the garden.

MIKALGARTH



Mike and Iris Worker's approx. 2/3rds of an acre garden created from a blank canvas over the past 9 years is situated in the village of Lastingham on the edge of the North York Moors. A flowing network of grass paths have been created with dense planting close to the bungalow which graduate to more expansive areas further from the property. Many interesting trees, shrubs and ornamental hedges have been planted to create varied pockets of planting including sunny & shaded damp areas, sweeping tall perennials, alpines planted in troughs and raised beds. Most recently a small, banked woodland area has been created from boulders uncovered during the creation of the garden.

LOCATION: Mikalgarth, Ings Lane, Lastingham, YO62 6TD

PARKING: Parking is available in the village requiring only a short walk to the garden.



NEWTON-ON-DERWENT

THE POPLARS



Around the Victorian house and barns, Peter and Christina Young have created densely planted gardens that include many unusual and tender plants, as well as fruit and vegetable gardens. At the far end of the five acre property, around a large wildlife pond, they have established an arboretum which now has almost 200 woody species.

OPEN Saturday 14 May; Sunday 11 Sept, 2 - 6pm

LOCATION: The Poplars, Main Street, Newton upon Derwent, York YO41 4DA, in the centre of the village

PARKING: at rear of The Poplars or on Main Street

SAND HUTTON & CLAXTON

Sunday 22 May, 1 - 5pm

FASGADALE HOUSE



Originally part of Sand Hutton Hall's parkland, this garden was designed in the late 60s by John Brookes – an absolute thrill for the current owners, Geoffrey and Caroline Hall, to discover his plan, as he is one of their garden heroes. The Halls have lived here for 20 years, but the garden is very much still of Brookes' ethos: a room outside that connects the house with the surrounding landscape. To quote his biography: showing "a confusion of tame and wild". One of the new parts of the garden is Caroline's collection of trees, inspired by her years of volunteering at the Arboretum.

LOCATION: Hall Drive, Sand Hutton YO41 1LA

PARKING: Sand Hutton and Claxton Village Hall; walk into Sand Hutton and Hall Drive is on the right at the junction.

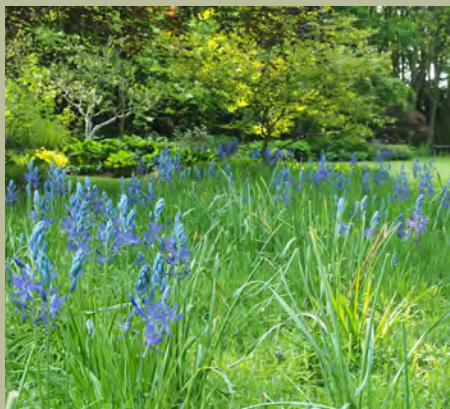
5 HALL DRIVE, SAND HUTTON



Owners June and Colin Garner are pleased to be supporting the Yorkshire Arboretum by opening their garden of approximately 2 acres. Originally part of the Sand Hutton Hall estate owned by the Walker family, remnants of the original garden such as the Walled Garden from the 1820's are still standing. The garden is of contemporary design with no specific theme other than a multitude of trees, conifers including topiary yew, herbaceous perennials, roses and rhododendrons and azaleas all connected by ponds, streams and waterfalls. Highlights include a small arboretum with many specimens (ginkgo, cherries, birches and dogwoods), a 30m long herbaceous border, a Japanese gravel garden and within the Walled Garden raised vegetable beds, soft fruit and cordon apple trees and a grass meadow where sheep gently graze.

LOCATION: Hall Drive, Sand Hutton YO41 1LA

PARKING: Sand Hutton and Claxton Village Hall; walk into Sand Hutton and Hall Drive is on the right at the junction.



SEATON ROSS

WEATHERVANE HOUSE

Peter Williams' large woodland garden with acid loving plants including rhododendrons, azaleas, magnolias and other interesting shrubs. Spring bulbs including trilliums, flowering trees and shade tolerant herbaceous perennials. Well-stocked glasshouse and large polytunnel with wide range of plants propagated from seeds, cuttings and grafting. Meadow area and woodland home to owls, goldcrests and sparrow hawks.

OPEN: Wednesday 18 May 12 - 5pm.

LOCATION: Mill Lane, Seaton Ross, York, YO42 4NE.
Sixth property on the left after entering the village from the north (via Bielby or Melbourne)

PARKING: On road unless signed otherwise



Wednesday 22 June, 10am - 5pm

CHAPEL FARM

Large cottage garden with mature flowering shrubs and herbaceous plants that are at their peak in June. Seating areas at rear with a large wildlife-friendly pond, meadow area and views across the fields to the Wolds

LOCATION: Chapel Farm, Church Lane, Seaton Ross.
YO42 4LS

PARKING: Happy for people with mobility problems to park on the drive, otherwise on the road/small car park near the church.

ASHLANDS

Davina and Dave Raffaelli's garden has been planned with lower maintenance in mind. Shrubs such as rhododendrons and roses are under planted with spring and summer bulbs and herbaceous foliage plants like Hostas and ferns. Part of the garden is heavily shaded by the churchyard trees. Paths behind the beds enable visitors to walk around and among the garden.

LOCATION: Ashlands, Church Lane, Seaton Ross,
YO42 4LS

PARKING: On the road.



SELBY

BRIDGE FARM HOUSE



Barbara and Richard Ferrari welcome you to their 2 acre garden divided by hedges into separate areas planted for year round interest with many unusual plants. Includes long double mixed borders, bog and gravel gardens, interesting and beautiful trees. Plus hens, impressive compost heaps and wildlife areas. Wheelchair access easiest by front gate. Please ask.

OPEN: Sunday 4th Sept, 12 - 4pm

LOCATION: Long Lane, Great Heck, DN14 0BE 6m S of Selby, 3m E M62 J34. From A19 take A645 towards Snaith at roundabout. After level crossing turn right at T-lights, left at T-junction onto Main St, past church, to T junction, cross to car park.

PARKING: In large field.

SKIPWITH HALL



We are delighted to welcome back Skipwith Hall to our programme this year. The 4-acre walled garden of Charles and Rosalind Forbes Adam's Queen Anne home (not open). This stunning garden features extensive mixed borders and lawns, and walled areas by renowned designer Cecil Pinsent. Recreated working kitchen garden with 15' beech hedge, pleached fruit walks, herb maze and pool. Woodland with specimen trees and shell house. Decorative orchard with espaliered and fan-trained fruit on walls. Italian Garden recently restored.

OPEN: Wednesday 8 June 11am - 4pm

LOCATION: Skipwith Hall, Selby YO8 5SH

PARKING: In large field.

SETTRINGTON

1 KIRK HILL FARM

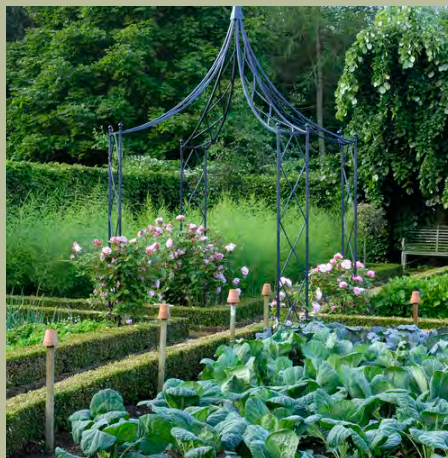


A chance to see Arboretum Director John Grimshaw's garden at two different points of the summer. In June many smaller perennials will be in flower, and foliage plants will be at their freshest. By September the garden has grown up to its maximum height and the autumn border plants will be reaching their peak. The garden is also home to Silver Sebright bantams and ornamental pheasants.

OPEN DATE(S): Sunday 12 June; Sunday 18 Sept, 12 - 5pm

LOCATION: 1 Kirk Hill Farm, Settrington, YO17 8NT

PARKING: Parking as directed in the adjacent farmyard.



SHERBURN

JACKSON'S WOLD



2 acre garden situated on the edge of the Yorkshire Wolds comprising of a walled garden with mixed borders, numerous old shrub roses under planted with unusual perennials. Woodland paths lead to further shrub borders. A traditional vegetable garden framed by a Victorian greenhouse leads to a wild flower meadow.

OPEN DATE(S): Sunday 8 May, 1 - 5pm

LOCATION: Jackson's Wold, Sherburn YO17 8QJ

PARKING: On grass outside garden

SINNINGTON

FRIAR'S HILL



Win Baldwin's 1 $\frac{3}{4}$ acre garden is an exceptional garden especially in spring, including hellebores, narcissi, fritillaries, trilliums, early peonies, and other early gems.

OPEN: Saturday 9th April, 1.30 - 4.30pm

LOCATION: Sinnington YO62 6SL

PARKING: On road or village green with short walk to Friars Hill

WELBURN

MANESTY



Joyce and Harry Kingman's north facing garden was previously a stackyard. Stone found on site was used to build several retaining walls and a rockery with water feature. A Yorkstone terrace leads between gravelled areas to a lawn surrounded by mixed borders giving year-round interest. Parts of the garden must be viewed as 'work in progress' this year because of the removal of a large conifer and the reorganisation and replanting of some beds.

OPEN: Sunday 3 July, 2 - 6pm

LOCATION: Main Street, Welburn, York YO60 7DZ.
Approaching Welburn from the west (arboretum side) second house on the left.

PARKING: On street but please park thoughtfully to avoid blocking driveways



WESTOW

PADDOCK COTTAGE



Helen and Colin Crews have a small cottage garden with views across countryside and attractive mixed borders and a wide range of plants in both sunny and shaded areas. In particular in late spring and early summer there are hellebores, Meconopsis and Iris. There are also raised vegetable plots, two small glasshouses and a fishpond.

OPEN: Sunday 12 June; Sunday 18 Sept, 12 - 5pm

LOCATION: 4 Sudniction Croft, Westow, YO60 7NB.
In Westow take the road (Main Street) signposted Burythorpe & Church. Before reaching a turning to the Church only, turn left down a gravel track signposted Sudniction Croft on wall.

Parking: Limited parking near house, otherwise on nearby streets

WILBERFOSS

LINDEN LODGE



Robert Scott & Jarrod Marsden's property has 6 acres in total, including a 1 acre garden, owner designed and constructed since 2000. Gravel paths edged with brick or lavender, many borders with unusual mixed herbaceous perennials, shrubs and feature trees. A wild life pond, summer house, kitchen garden, glasshouse, orchard and woodland area. A formal garden to the east of the house with pond and water feature. A further 5 acres of developing meadow with cut pathways, various small groupings of indigenous trees and over 450 Norway Spruce, hens and Shetland sheep. A new vegetable plot 30m by 15m with poly tunnel. There are numerous seats and also in the far field, a field hut to sit in with views towards the Yorkshire Wolds.

OPEN: Friday 26 & Saturday 27 August, 11 - 4pm

LOCATION: Newbridge Lane, nr Wilberfoss, York YO41 5RB. 10m E of York. From York on the A1079, ignore signs for Wilberfoss, take next turning signed Bolton village, after 1m at the Xrds, turn L onto Newbridge Lane, Linden Lodge is on R in 200m.

PARKING: Opposite on grass verge



YORK

CALM COTTAGE



Surrounding Philip and Jane Ingham's Regency villa near York, this garden has a ha-ha and a wall covered in climbers and fruit trees. The mixed borders were redesigned in the 1990s. No dogs on the lawn please. Visitors can walk through the field and down a wood in dry weather back to the lane.

OPEN DATE(S): Sunday 19 June, 2 - 5pm

LOCATION: Malton Road, York, YO32 9TH. Off the Hopgrove roundabout near Beechwood Caravan Club

PARKING: On the lane or near the house for the less able

FOSSGYL



Alastair Fitter's long 1 acre garden stretches from Huntington Road to the River Foss. There are perennial borders, an alpine bed, a peat-free 'peat' bed, a woodland garden, a traditional orchard with 85 year old trees mixed with more recently planted specimen trees and shrubs, a meadow with fritillaries in spring and orchids in summer, wet woodland by the river with oxlips in spring, and a large wildlife pond fringed with primulas, irises and native wetland plants. A new feature is an alpine house. There are over 1200 species of plant in the garden, including over 250 natives.

OPEN: Saturday 7 May, 12 - 5 pm.

LOCATION: 533 Huntington Road, York YO32 9PY. 200m north of Huntington School

PARKING: Disabled parking down long narrow drive (but you may have to reverse out), or on local side streets (Burn Estate & Arbor Close)

TREGONNING



'Tregonning' is a 1½ acre, fully organic family garden bursting with wildlife and contained within old 'Enclosure Award' hedges full of tree sparrows. Over many years, composts and mulches have been extensively used to feed and condition the sandy loam. Fruit and heritage vegetables are grown for family use together with a ¾ acre wildlife meadow, several wildlife ponds and two wells. Separate garden areas, each with herbaceous borders feature a collection of old roses combined with hardy perennials. A small glasshouse houses heritage varieties of Pelargoniums and another is used for heritage tomatoes.

OPEN: Saturday 18 June, 1 – 4 pm.

LOCATION: Main Street, Ellerton, York YO42 4NZ

PARKING: On the road outside the property

John Grimshaw

COEXISTENCE: NATIVES AND EXOTICS AT THE YORKSHIRE ARBORETUM

John Grimshaw describes how the arboretum is managed for both the mostly exotic woody plant collection and the natural biodiversity found on the site. The arboretum is one of the richest locations for native plants remaining in the Howardian Hills - and with the plants come the insects, birds and other animals.

Ben Preston

YORK GATE THROUGH A HEAD GARDENER'S EYE

Ben Preston is Head Gardener at York Gate, at Adel near Leeds, the flagship garden for the horticultural charity, Perennial. The body of the talk will describe the layered planting through the seasons and how York Gate has evolved from a small family garden to one open to the public from April to September. Full of interesting plants and the development of a wonderful Yorkshire garden.

USING SCIENCE TO TAKE DEFORESTATION OFF THE SHOPPING LIST

Roger Young is chief executive of Agroisolabs, based in nearby Welburn, a specialist facility for tracking the origins of natural products through analysis of their chemical composition. In this talk he will tell us about their work for the World Forest ID project, which aims to control the illegal timber trade by identifying the origins of suspect shipments. Find out how the arboretum is helping this exciting work.

THE BACKHOUSE NURSERIES OF YORK AND THEIR TREES

In the 1800s the Backhouse family of York were amongst the world's leading nurserymen, with extensive production grounds, partly now occupied by West Bank Park, Acomb. Gillian Parker has been researching the dynasty for some time and in this talk will tell us about their tree-growing business – which did particularly well in Queen Victoria's jubilee years.

ORGANIC GARDENING

Debs has been a committed organic gardener for many years, first at Osborne House and later as Head Gardener at Highgrove for HRH The Prince of Wales. Now living on the Isle of Wight she will use these experiences to tell us about the principles and practice of organic gardening. This talk will be given remotely via Zoom.
